Serge and Joe are blood relatives from two continents who only learned of each other in 1995. They will inspire and fascinate you with their stories of success in achieving their dreams. Attributes they relied on included a dream, creative thinking, and a positive attitude of gratitude; plus passion, enthusiasm, persistence, dedication, risk taking, and step-by-step execution.

FEAT

First recorded human to run “Around the World”. This was accomplished by running the distance of the circumference of the world, primarily in the Southern Hemisphere. Serge’s entourage was simply his wife, Nicole, riding a small motorcycle at his side; they lived out of a pup tent. Nicole chronicled their days with camera, video, and pen. Serge’s purpose was to achieve his dream of proving his running endurance ability and raising awareness of the plight of children in Third World Countries. Serge drank 5.5 tons of Coca Cola on the world tour, wore out 64 pairs of shoes and 120 pairs of socks. He averaged more than a marathon every other day for 1,901 days or 63 months. The obstacles Serge and Nicole overcame with persistence to go over, under, around, or through hurdles will amaze and inspire listeners. This is a prime example of what nearly anyone can achieve with a dream, creative thinking, passion, and step-by-step execution. It is a way for leaders to learn and lead.

Co-founder and CEO of an entrepreneurial company that in less than 10 years, from start-up in 1996, became the 8th largest pet food/treat company in the world. Joe and his wife, Judy, had no previous knowledge of experience in the pet industry. They basically achieved this with one product in more than 60 countries. More than 750 million Greenies® were sold – enough that if laid end-to-end would circle the globe 1.67 times. It would take an employee 90 years to count to 750 million at the rate of 1 number per second. Creative thinking, building personal relationships, and use of appropriate incentives were basic to their success. Joe and his wife have shared stories of their alliances with people and companies, as well as the philosophy and culture they nurtured into a successful business endeavor. S&M NuTec, its products, and its founders were honored with more than 4 dozen awards and honors between January 2002 and mid-2006 including an American Business Association for the Best Overall Company with under 100 Employees. Joe & Judy sold S&M NuTec to the Mars Company in May 2006.

PHILOSOPHY & MOTIVATON

This is a great big world to see and experience including a fascinating humanity, diverse, cultures, and many social and economic differences including poverty and the plight of children in Third World countries. Serge, the son of middle-income parents was born in a developed country, Switzerland, but under adverse conditions. He was born 4 months premature and weighed in at just 3.5 pounds. He actually was born on a street of Zurich between a taxi cab and the hospital door. Born a “fighter” and “survivor”, he became an achiever. He turned running, initially training for boxing, into a life-long endeavor in which he became highly proficient. Serge learns as he goes using common sense, creative, critical, and passionate thinking, calculated risk-taking, and a step-by-step approach to go over, under, around, or through obstacles to achieve what no human as ever accomplished previously-to run the world! He provides no back-up plan for his dream, as a backup plan is always an easy way to change course without trying all other options to succeed in reaching one’s goals. Teamwork is crucial to success in reaching one’s goals, even if it is just a team of two, such as Serge and Nicole.

Joe is the great grandson of an orphaned Swiss immigrant. After only six weeks of arriving to America and knowing no English, only 3 of the 25 Roetheli family members aboard the ship were still alive-the oldest of these three orphans was Joe’s great grandfather who was just 9-the others died of cholera in an epidemic that was raging when they arrived at Hermann, Missouri. Joe’s parents, grandparents, and great grandparents eked out meager livings on small farms on the edge of the Ozarks. Despite his parents having only had the opportunity for an 8th grade education, he persisted to earn a Ph.D. Joe learned the value of hard work, self discipline, and good morals. He believes that a dream and positive attitude are keys to success and that creative thinking, hard work, and achieving personal attitude of gratitude. He has always been passionate, persistent, and prepared; plus creative. Correct incentives and reinforcements are powerful goals greatly reinforce a positive can-do & will-do attitude of gratitude. Correct incentives are powerful motivating forces that drive achievement and progress.

MESSAGE

Everyone can and should have a dream for their life. By supplementing a dream with desire, dedication, and self discipline plus willingness to accept risk, much can much can be achieved with little. You can have a dream and achieve it too, no matter what your circumstances, if you want it bad enough to sacrifice, take calculated risks, and use your talents effectively. We succeeded; you can too!
